It gives me great pleasure to present the Surveying & Mapping Industry Council of NSW (SMIC) Annual Report for 2019/2020. The Council held four meetings during the year in addition to its Annual General Meeting: 26 July, 29 November 2019, 7 February and 2 April 2020.

During the year, the Chair represented SMIC at the following events:
